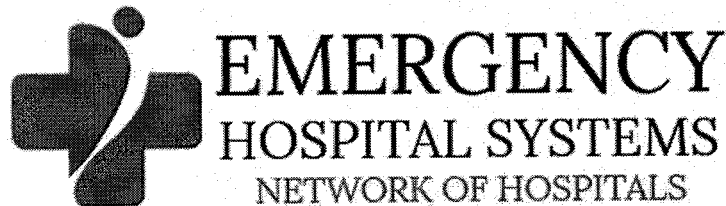

**Phase 1A:**

- Frontline healthcare workers and residents at long-term care facilities, plus people over 65 or with a chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from Covid-19.

**Phase 1B:**

- People 65 years of age and older.
- People 16 years of age and older with a least one chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes Covid-19, such as but not limited to:
  - Cancer
  - Chronic kidney disease
  - COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
  - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies
  - Solid organ transplantation
  - Obesity and sever obesity (body mass index of 30 kg/m2 or higher)
  - Pregnancy
  - Sickle cell disease
  - Type 2 diabetes mellitus

You must register through our call center to secure an appointment for the vaccination. Once you have been confirmed for receiving the vaccine you will need to download the required documents through our website: [www.emergencyhospitals.care](http://www.emergencyhospitals.care). All consent forms must be filled out prior to your arrival to receive the vaccination. Anyone arriving at our testing site that does not have these forms completed will not be able to receive the vaccine and will be asked to reschedule for another time.

Texas Emergency Hospital is receiving limited amount of the vaccine. Once the allotted time slots have been filled, we will maintain a waiting list for future vaccine doses that we receive. We are working closely with the state to secure more vaccines, so we ask that you please be patient with us as we begin this process and work to end this horrible virus.

With the recent uptick of positive COVID-19 cases in our community, we continue to encourage everyone to wear a face covering, practice social distancing and proper hand hygiene.
